#### **News and Notes**

• We are finalizing our fall sports participation and schedules this week:

- We are confirmed for having 5th/6th and 7th/8th grade girls volleyball teams this season. Coach Tamborino will be working with 7th/8th, and Coach Mulholland will be working with 5th/6th. The first thing that needs to be done is for the girls to return their completed applications to the Main Office no later than Thursday, August 31. The coaches will follow up with the girls who sign up regarding the practice and game schedules shortly.
- We \*may\* be able to field 5th/6th and 7th/8th Boys Soccer teams, but we are waiting for confirmation from the district. I should know by Monday, and if so, I'll get those applications to the boys so that they can submit them by Thursday as well. Stay tuned!
- Our sports programs for 5th-8th graders is a part of CPS Score, a free program that is an introduction to these sports for many students. Solomon provides awesome jerseys too. In the winter we will host girls and boys basketball, as well as flag football and track and field in the spring, as long as we have enough registrants and coaches.
- Dates for this year have not been finalized, but this is the first notification that your child may receive a vision and/or hearing screener.
  - Vision screenings are required for (1) all Pre-K, Kindergarten, 2nd grade, and 8th grade students, (2) all students who are new to the district, and (3) all students with or have an upcoming evaluation for an IEP.
  - Hearing screenings are required for (1) all Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st grade, 2nd grade, and 3rd grade students, (2) all students who are new to the district, and (3) all students with or have an upcoming evaluation for an IEP
  - To learn more about the screening process, click <u>here</u>. This letter will be updated with the dates of the screenings when they are available.
- COVID protocols for the 2023-2024 school year: Like last year, families are asked to
  report any student positive COVID tests at <u>cps.edu/covidresults</u>. Students will be
  required to isolate for 5 days, with the exact dates of the isolation being dictated by the
  district's contact tracers. Schools will be informed of positive tests by the contact tracers,
  and then communication will go out to the families of close contacts, notifying them of a
  positive test and the availability of take-home COVID tests. In-school PCR testing is no
  longer available. Masking is optional for students, staff, and community members that
  have not tested positive for COVID within the 10 day window. Please click <u>here</u> to read
