News and Notes

- We need your help in keeping our streets cleared for bus pick-up and drop-off. As a reminder, please do not park between the "No Parking" street signs on Avers Ave. at pick-up and drop-off to ensure that our buses can line up in their designated areas. Once the snow hits, then we need to ensure that our students and particularly those with mobility needs have safe spaces to enter and exit. As a reminder, our staff puts out additional "No Parking" signs on that side of Avers as a reminder. Additionally, please do not park in the designated accessible parking space on Hamlin Ave. at any time, unless you have a placard. We appreciate your assistance.
- A reminder about our Halloween procedures on Tuesday:
 - Halloween will be celebrated at Solomon on Tuesday, October 31, 2023.
 Students are not required to dress up, and we offer this as an optional activity for students and staff.
 - Nut-free candy can be brought to school for trick-or-treat purposes. Students will exchange candy, healthier snack alternatives, or trinkets (pencils, etc.) during a classroom trick-or-treat. Teachers will seal the bags after distribution so that students do not eat treats during the school day. This ensures that parents have discretion over what their child eats. There will not be any in-school consumption of treats. Note: Please help us keep our facilities clean by encouraging students to throw any wrappers or trash in the garbage cans around our campus.
 - There will be a parade for students in grades K through 2nd grade, inside the building for students, starting at 10:45am. Students will travel internally from Door #3 to Door #6, exit via Door #6, and then return back through Door #3 to go back to their classrooms. Parents are welcome to watch the parade from our lobby and main office hallway. While you may take pictures of your child, please do not take pictures or video record other students.
 - Students in grades PK through 2nd will head off for their walking field trip to the convent at 2:20pm.

- Pre-K (108) will perform a few fall songs for parents outside of Door #1 at 9:10am and 1:20pm. If there is inclement weather, parents will be invited into our gymnasium for the performance.
- On costumes:
 - Students should either wear their costume all day or have a costume they can put on themselves so that teachers are not required to assist.
 - All costumes must be school-appropriate, which includes no masks, toy weapons, and fake blood.
- Teachers will follow up with parents directly if they have particular requests for their classroom on October 31, 2023. Teachers have the option of hosting classroom parties with parents this year, and if they choose to do so, they will communicate directly with parents.
- Calling all veterans (and friends and family of veterans: With the exception of a few years during the COVID pandemic, we have hosted the <u>Veterans' Celebration Day</u> at Solomon since 2001, and we are excited to start planning for the 2023 event. Navy Band Great Lakes is ready to perform, and we invite all veterans in the community to join us at Solomon on November 16, 2023, from 9:00-11:30am.
